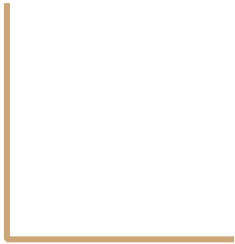
Social Justice Sound Bites: The rundown

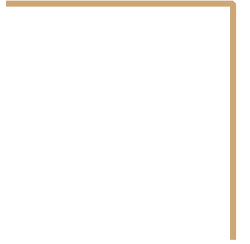
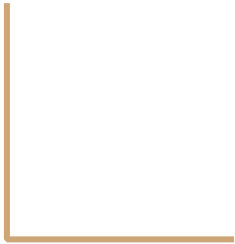
