




However...

do <u>not</u> know how to get help from community agencies (Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital).






Increase awareness and encourage utilization of community resources targeted toward the medical, legal, and psychosocial needs of intimate partner violence survivors through the creation of physical and online resource guides.

Why?

An overarching barrier to help-seeking in IPV survivors is a lack of awareness about available services and how they operate (Robinson et. al 2020).

After the COVID-19 pandemic, there is an urgent need to increase virtual outreach and safety planning to survivors (Sabri et. al 2020).






