People believe men are more entitled to orgasm during sex than women, and that male entitlement is a main cause for the lack of equality in orgasm and satisfaction during sex (Klein and Conley).



"The majority of women are not able to reliably experience orgasm during sexual activity with a partner, and around 10% are never able to experience orgasm in any situation" (Salisbury).



"Only 30 states require sex ed of any kind, and only 22 require it to be medically, factually or technically accurate" (National Conference of State Legislature, University Wire).


Impact and Evaluation
