


Research and Project Foundation

- Traditional gender roles related to family responsibilities




Lawyers by Race and Ethnicity 2024





- Encourage more speaker series at other universities




Feminist Leadership




Being in a space full of Latina women who are confident and successful in a field predominantly full of white cis men.

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
